CCTV'S MISSION & VALUES

EMPOWERING people to COMMUNICATE and providing COMMUNITY INFORMATION through TELEVISION.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION

A well-informed, actively involved citizenry makes more responsible decisions. CCTV televises local government meetings, activities of local schools, and service-related information to stimulate an active dialogue among elected officials, schools, and local citizens.

DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

Democracy is most effective in a society in which all members can participate. CCTV encourages understanding and collaboration across barriers of race, culture, language, class, gender and age.

MEDIA LITERACY

Community media offers an alternative to commercial television. CCTV provides the training and tools necessary for people to become knowledgeable and effective communicators, able to view television critically and to use that medium to tell their own stories.

COMMUNITY DECISION-MAKING

Freedom of expression alone is not enough to ensure a healthy democracy. Citizens must also enter into active discussion and debate in order to participate in solving problems for the common good. CCTV promotes the use of non-commercial channels 21, 22, 23 and production facilities as an electronic forum for discussing issues and solving problems.

DEMOCRACY & THE FIRST AMENDMENT

All people in a democracy have the right and responsibility to take part in the decisions that affect them and their communities. Freedom of speech is vital to a healthy democracy and is guaranteed in the First Amendment. CCTV provides the community with the opportunity for political, cultural, artistic, spiritual, and individual expression on television.



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

OUR COMMUNITY WANTS LOCAL INFORMATION & NEWS AND CCTV IS STEPPING UP!

In early 2019 CCTV began conversations with members of our community about their needs and their expectations of CCTV. We talked with a range of people who in turn work or volunteer for many community organizations. Our respondents ranged from people present at the 1990 start of CCTV programming to those who had moved to this community just weeks earlier. We learned a lot. Highlights include:

- Community support for CCTV is very strong even though the number of cable TV subscribers is decreasing.
- Our community wants much more local news and information
- CCTV is known for production far more than training, studios and equipment
- Our community increasingly goes on-line for information
- Our community looks forward to FM 98.3, a new radio station time-shared by CCTV and radio partner Mano a Mano

Let's look at last year and at CCTV's plans for the next twelve months.

MULTIMEDIA AND EMERGENCY INFORMATION WING TO BE COMPLETED IN LATE 2019

Based on CCTV's recommendation, the City of Salem and Marion County purchased vacant space adjacent to and east of CCTV. When remodeled and equipped, this new wing will enable community groups to simultaneously reach a television, internet and radio audience. The wing will provide an ideal emergency information distribution hub to Salem and Marion County. The design phase is complete, a complete remodel is next and we're eagerly anticipating use of the multimedia wing.

RADIO 98.3 TO GO ON THE AIR IN LATE 2019

The day is near! Thirteen years after City of Salem staff asked CCTV to look into low power FM radio as a way to distribute emergency information, CCTV and radio partner Mano a Mano will launch and time-share full power 98/3 FM radio—KMWW for CCTV and KTUP for Mano. Added to TV and the internet, radio completes the three-legged stool of media that CCTV will use to serve our community.

REBRANDING AND MARKETING, HONORING THE PAST AND LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

In late summer of 2019, CCTV will initiate a process to rebrand and market community media services. The addition of radio elevates the need to reach more members of our community, and to recognize the expansion of CCTV since 1989.

18-19 HIGHLIGHTS



Things are always happening at CCTV! Take a look at some highlights from the past year.

JULY 2018

This past July, CCV introduced a fleet of brand new Sony camcorders, Manfrotto carbon fiber tripods, and MacBook Pro editing laptops to our inventory. This equipment is available for checkout to all Salem residents for non-commercial use, at no cost. We are so excited to be able to offer this high-end production equipment to our community!

AUG 2018

This year, July's summer video camps were so popular that they filled up within 48 hours of registration opening! In order to give more students the opportunity to participate, CCTV opened up two more weeks of camp in August, for a total of 5 weeks of fun in the studios!



SEP 2018

In line with CCTV's fundamental belief that a well-informed, actively involved citizenry makes more responsible decisions, CCTV spent September partnering with League of Women voters and other agencies to create locally-focused and informative elections programming, providing an opportunity for all candidates to speak directly to voters in the area.

OCT 2018

As a way to more actively engage the arts community in Salem and surrounding areas, CCTV hosted its first ever Community Media Film Festival in October. The event culminated in an awards ceremony at Nothern Lights Theater on Oct. 20th, Community Media Day.



NOV 2018

One of CCTV's yearly highlights is inviting our area non-profits in to the studios in for Holiday Greetings each November. This year was no different, and we were delight to record festive promo material for over 50 organizations this year!

DEC 2018

December saw CCTV's training room converted to a recording studio for Tiny Desk Contest videos, recorded to help local musicians gain exposure.





JAN 2019

In January, CCTV staff partnered with Center 50+ to offer weekly video production and editing classes to seniors away from our studios. Students at Center 50+ have access to retired CCTV equipment, which they use to record events and other projects at the senior center.

FEB 2019

Following on the heels of a successful Holiday Greetings in November, this February CCTV hosted Faith & Fellowship Greetings. This event was created as a way to include churches and other religious organizations in the studio fun, and to introduce them to other ways they can utilize CCTV's services!

MAR 2019

Spring music kicked off early this year, in March, with a new production. In addition to the Middle School and High School concerts CCTV staff usually record, this year we were able to include local elementary schools in the fun while recording the 2019 Elementary Choral Festival.

APR 2019

Finding new ways to partner with our community is an important part of CCTV's work in Salem! This April, we were lucky to work with the local NAACP chapter to record seminars at the annual African American Youth Leadership Conference.



MAY 2019

Did you know Salem has a semi-pro women's soccer team? In May, CFC Atletica showed CCTV staff and volunteers some fancy footwork while interviewing on CCTV's non-profit showcase, InSight.

JUN 2019

As always, we ended the fiscal year with a bang, recording 10 graduations, 11 live music sets at Make Music Day, and 12 World Beat performances, all in the month of June!

For the third year, CCTV participated in Make Music Day, a free celebration of music around the world. Launched over 35 years ago, Make Music Day is held every summer solstice in over 1,000 cities and 120 countries. This year, CCTV elevated its presence by going live from downtown Salem on Comcast Channel 22/322 HD and on Facebook!

Known as the High 101 stage (behind Willamette Valley Bank), the lineup included everything from rock, to hip hop, to a performance in American Sign Language. CCTV staff handed out prizes and band swag, while Trader Joe's offered bottled water and snacks to passersby. Eighteen local bands and artists performed throughout the day, keeping the music going from 12:00pm to 10:00pm.

Thanks to the help of 19 volunteers and staff members, Make Music Day Salem was a huge success. We look forward to continuing this event in the future!

Film Fest

This year, CCTV pioneered a brand new film festival in Salem called the Community Media Film Fest! It began as a way to honor Community Media Day, an annual celebration of voices that brings awareness to the importance of local and accessible media for all individuals to have their voices heard.

In its inaugural year, CCTV received nearly 40 entries across 13 categories. Entries were judged by community members, and winners were honored at Northern Lights Theater on Community Media Day, October 20th. CCTV NON-PROFIT SERVICES

CCTV builds community by supporting Salem area non-profit and government organizations. This year, CCTV served local non-profit organizations through producing PSA's, video spotlights, holiday greetings, event coverage, community billboard slides, and free access to production resources.

INSIGHT TRACKS NON-PROFIT NEWS

InSight, CCTV's flagship non-profit program, is hosted and produced by Wendy Brokaw. For this program, Wendy invites local non-profits into the studios for an in-depth look at their latest news, success stories, and what Salem residents can do to get involved. This year, with the help of co-hosts Mary Louise Vannatta and Ross Sutherland, Wendy produced **14** new episodes of InSight, each highlighting a local Salem organization.

COMMUNITY BILLBOARD

In addition to the production and equipment services that CCTV offers to local non-profits and individuals, we offer organizations the ability post general information and event announcements directly to the channels in the form of Community Billboards. These slides, created by organizations or created by CCTV staff on request, are a great opportunity for smaller groups to get information out quickly, in a way that doesn't have as high a barrier as producing a video spot. This year, CCTV helped local non-profit and government organizations by posting **63** new community billboard slides to channels 21 and 23.



Non-Profit Holiday Greetings and Faith & Fellowship Event

Once a year, right before the holiday season shifts into high gear, CCTV invites local non-profit organizations into the studio for a special opportunity to record their own holiday video. These messages, produced and edited by CCTV staff and volunteers, play on CCTV's channels through the new year, and are made available to each group to post on their own social media and websites.

These videos have become a hallmark event for CCTV, and local organizations look forward to kicking off the holiday season with the whimsical, wintry set in the studios. In 2018, over the course of 4 days, CCTV hosted 38 local non-profit groups in the studio, each with their own take on holiday spirit!

On the heels of Holiday Greetings success, this year CCTV implemented a new spring event, entitled "Faith & Fellowship". Realizing that a large percentage of Salem's non-profit community is comprised of religious and faith-based organizations, we offered an event created specifically for those groups. In its first year, Faith & Fellowship provided 18 local churches and faith-based organizations with free video services. Because of this event, several groups learned more about CCTV and began producing their own programs, that now play regularly on CCTV channel 23.



We look forward to serving local non-profits again next year to help bring good cheer and holiday spirit to our community over cable and online!

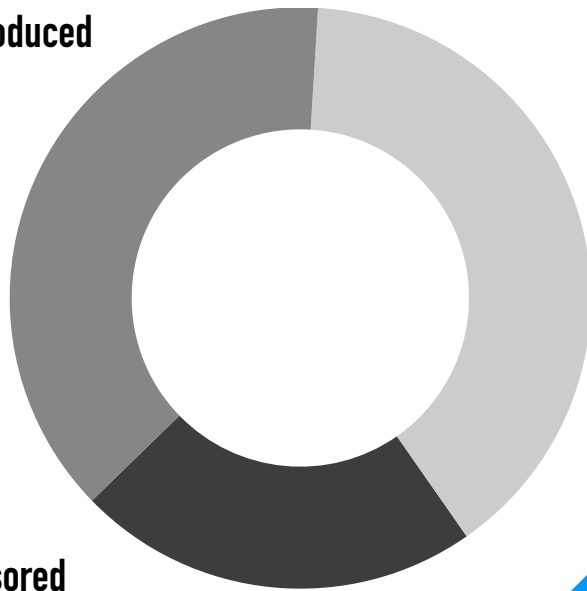

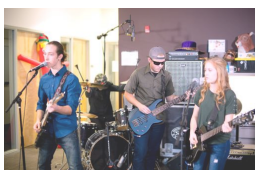
In total, CCTV aired over **1,940** hours of new programming on our **3** channels. Congratulations to all our 2018-2019 producers!

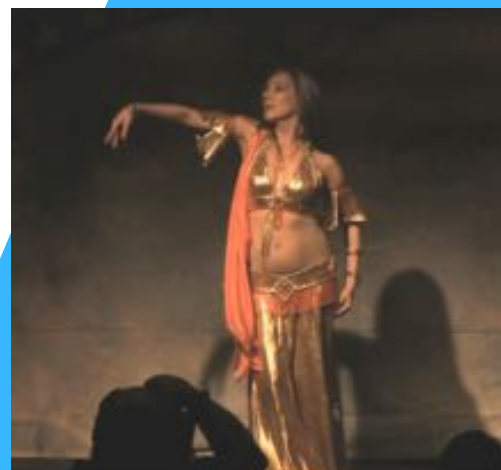

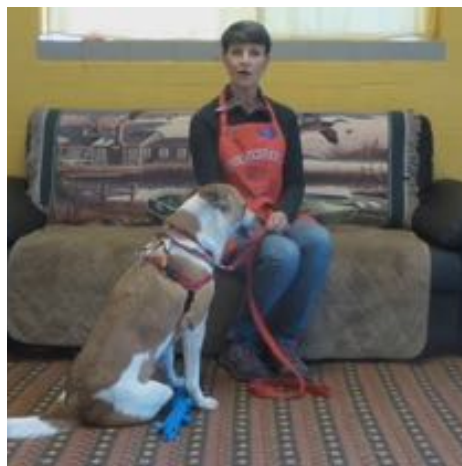

CCTV TRAINING

CAMERA This introductory course teaches students how to operate CCTV's high-definition camcorders that are available for checkout. The class covers basic shooting practices and using a tripod.

EDIT A two-hour course for beginning editors in Final Cut Pro X editing software. The class walks students through many of the basic software features, giving editors the tools they need to finish their first program.

STUDIO Students learn how to make a program in CCTV's studios from start to finish. Training includes operation of studio cameras, audio mixing, directing, creating graphics, lighting a set and more.

To accommodate more students, staff created three more weeks of camp in early August, which allowed 25 more students to experience summer video camp in our studios. We're looking forward to increasing capacity again next summer to welcome more young producers in our doors!

FOR 5 WEEKS this July and August, CCTV was taken over by staff member Ashley Gruber and 60 enthusiastic filmmakers, aged 10 to 15 years old, for our annual camp (SVC). Each week of camp had a different theme: week one taught the basics of camera function and shot composition, week two was a study in stop-motion animation, week three was taught studio production more in depth, and so on. Skills learned over the summer

culminated in a screening premiere and ice cream party for students and their families.

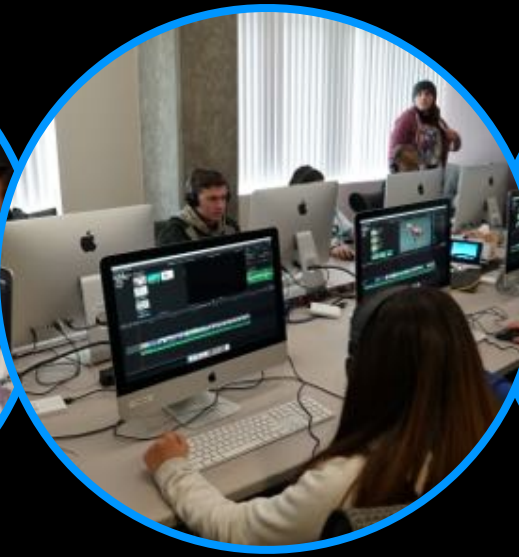

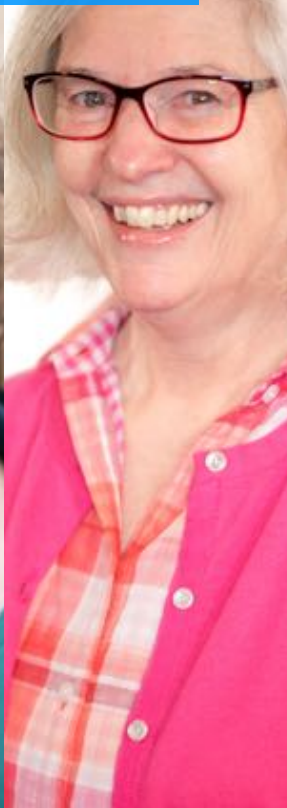
